Official Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting





The Gift of Time and Alzheimer's

More than six million Americans are estimated to have Alzheimer's today, and everyone who has the disease will die of it or with it. There are no survivors. There are no treatments that stop or slow progression of the disease. But what if a medication could delay the progression of Alzheimer's and give individuals and families more good days together...or even years?

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has approved the drug Aducanumab, a new treatment for Alzheimer's. A clinical trial of Aducanumab reported a 22% reduction in cognitive and functional decline compared to placebo.

Any delay in disease progression for someone with Alzheimer's can make a very real difference, as we hear so frequently from people who face it. To deny those who face Alzheimer's and their loved ones an opportunity to have more precious time together is neither equitable nor humane. It's time for more time for those facing Alzheimer's.




DID YOU KNOW:

The 91 volunteers who came from all over the states, worked on a number of tasks throughout





the project, from landscaping, to cleanup, to new construction, and even building a new frisbee golf course. The volunteers also worked on the horse corral, creating a frontier theme.

"We both went to camp as kids, and we know that people gave to make our camps good. INGREDIENTS

- 4 slices bacon or smoked turkey, chopped
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 1 1/2 pounds green beans, trimmed, cut in half
- 3/4 teaspoon seasoned salt
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- pinch of crushed red pepper flakes
- 1 tablespoon butter

DIRECTIONS

- Turn Instant Pot on SAUTE mode. When hot, coat inner pot with cooking spray and add bacon. Cook until bacon is crisp.
- 2. Add onion and cook 1 more minute.
- 3. Hit "Cancel" and add chicken broth. Scrape up any browned bits on the bottom. Add remaining ingredients. Place lid on Instant Pot and set to Pressure Cook for 7 minutes. Let pot do a Natural Release for 5 to 10 minutes (less for firmer beans). Then open valve to let out any remaining pressure. Remove the lid when the pin drops.
- Notes: Cooking time does not include the time it takes for the pressure cooker to pressurize. This can take about 10 minutes.
